Wildcat Creek Scenic Driving Route
This scenic driving tour along the Wildcat Creek takes you past historic Adams Mill, the Adams Mill (1872) and Lancaster covered bridges, Warren Adams house (Italianate, 1860), a round barn, and Xenia Bridge.



Wabash River Scenic Driving Route
This route follows the remnants of the Wabash & Erie Canal along Towpath Road. It crosses Carrollton Bridge. It travels through Lockport where you'll see historic Burris House and Potawatomi Spring. You'll cross over Indiana's oldest bridge, the 1837 Burnett's Creek Arch, pass two Trail of Death monuments, and discover how the Millrace in Pittsburg supplied many mills with power.



Antiques & Uniques Driving Route
Whether you are looking for that perfect treasure for your home or a special gift for someone else, you will find it in one of Carroll County's delightful communities. Find a piece of the past in a variety of antique shops, each containing that small town charm. Furnishings, china, glassware and even vintage clothing and jewelry are available here.



Canoe Routes
You have a choice of four waterways to canoe: the Wabash and Tippecanoe Rivers and Wildcat and Deer Creeks. Use your own watercraft or rent one from an outfitter listed in this brochure. Many historical sites are on or near these waterways.

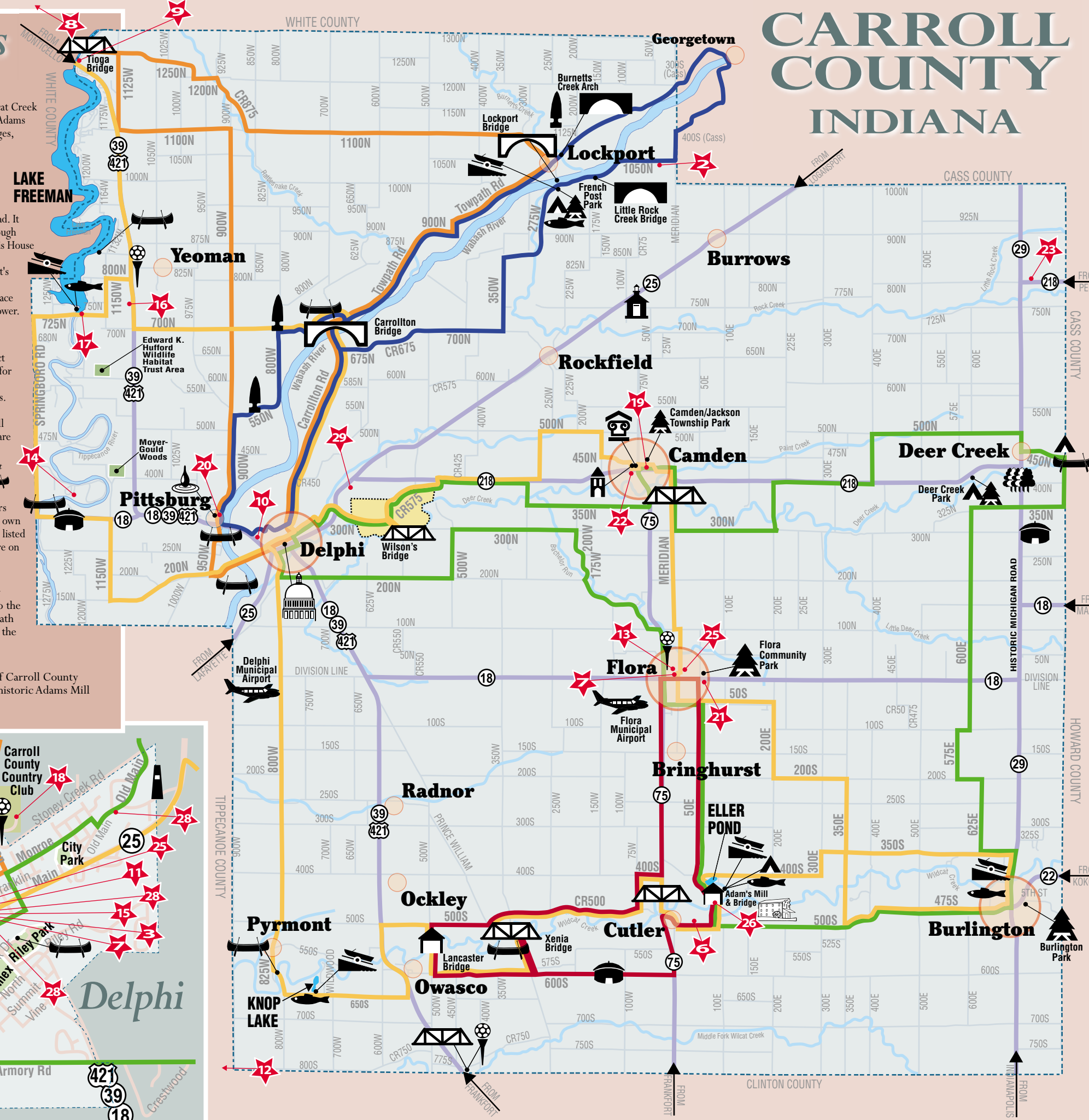


Bicycle Route #1
This route traverses through a gently rolling landscape of farms, down into the Wabash River Valley, and along Towpath Road, which parallels the remains of the Wabash and Erie Canal.



Bicycle Route #2
This route travels across the heart of Carroll County through its friendly towns and past historic Adams Mill and a covered bridge.

County Bridges

While enjoying the rural landscape of Carroll County, visitors and residents alike will have many opportunities to traverse the historic bridges that dot the county. Carroll County has over 100 bridges crossing major rivers such as the Wabash and Tippecanoe, as well as smaller creeks and tributaries. Of this large number of bridges, over 20 have been identified as historically significant. They vary in style and materials, from the older stone arch and wooden covered bridges, to those later made of metal and concrete. This map designates the location and type of 14 bridges.
