

BOARD OF WORKS & PUBLIC SAFETY SPECIAL MEETING

March 9, 2022 – 5:15 PM

Community Center, 311 N. Washington Street

Mayor Anita Werling opened the meeting at 5:15 p.m.

Spencer Kingery and Anita Werling were present; Kamron Yates attended via Zoom

Minutes of the February 23, 2022, meeting were presented for review. Spencer Kingery moved to approve. Second by Kamron Yates. In a voice vote, the minutes were accepted as presented. (3-0 — Ayes: Kingery, Werling, Yates)

Claims totaling \$451,398.41 were presented for approval. Kamron Yates moved to approve the claims. Second by Spencer Kingery. Motion carried. (3-0) Spencer Kingery moved to approve. Second by Kamron Yates. Kamron Yates questioned the Frontier bills and why one was higher than the others. Clerk-Treasurer Aldrich explained about the DSL contract for Well#5 and stated it was a 5-year contract signed by Mayor Evans in 2020. In a voice vote, the claims were approved. (3-0 — Ayes: Kingery, Werling, Yates)

Board Comments.

Mayor Werling asked JT Doane to brief the Board on the status of enforcement actions for properties on South Washington, West Franklin, East Summit and Cook Streets. Doane reported that he had been in contact with Mr. Echols by phone who stated that weather had prevented him from addressing issues at 402 S. Washington, but that he expected to get underway by week's end. 411 W. Franklin's owner has been sent an invoice for the costs of abatement undertaken by the City. A second notice was being sent to the owner and to the mortgage holder with additional items that need to be addressed at the property. Some items have been resolved at the Summit Street property, but several items still not resolved. Monitoring is continuing. Doane met with the property owner on Cook Street to inform that the City would begin undertaking abatement.



Public Comments.


