

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS & SAFETY MEETING

June 3, 2024 – 5:30PM

Second Floor, City Building, 201 S. Union Street

Mayor Kamron Yates opened the meeting at 5:30 p.m. Those present rose for the Pledge of Allegiance. The meeting was livestreamed on YouTube.

Clerk-Treasurer Julie Price called the roll. Present were Spencer Kingery, Breanna Maxwell, and Mayor Yates.

The minutes of the May 20th meeting were presented for review. There were no additions or corrections. Motion to approve by Spencer Kingery second by Breanna Maxwell. Minutes were approved as read and carried. (3-0)

The next order of business were regular claims for June 3, 2024 totaling \$1,094,509.28. Motion to accept the claims made by Spencer Kingery, second by Breanna Maxwell. Spencer Kingery asked about the additional funds being used to replenish the accounts from the 4650 loan. Clerk-treasurer Price stated that after checking with the SBOA and DLGF that the decision to move forward with the funding would be less cost than trying to establish another funding source and repeat the same steps from the initial loan processes. She also stated that both agencies confirmed that they would have on record that the Ordinance was put in to place to support the funding. Motion carried and passed. (3-0)

Other Business:

Keller Development was present to request using 2-60ft. boom lifts for 2 weeks beginning June 10th to paint and repair a building located at 113 E. Main St. They were asking for approval to take up possibly 4 parking spaces for the duration of the repairs. Spencer Kingery stated that if they were to need the lifts for more than the 2 weeks, they need to notify the board. It was requested that they use drop cloths on the sidewalks to prevent paint spillage. Motion to approve the lifts made by Spencer Kingery, second by Breanna Maxwell. Motion carried and passed. (3-0)

Dustin Johnson with DAA was present to request usage of Riley Park for a community outreach cookout that would include games, food, etc. The date for the request is July 20, 2024 from 1-4pm. The question was asked about contacting the parks board and if it would interfere with girl's softball tournament to which it was stated that the tournament would not be hosted there as of now. It was suggested by Spencer Kingery and agree by the board to table the request until there was a confirmation of no softball tournament and getting word from the parks board to approve the event for space needed to host the event.

Miscellaneous Business.

Mark Smith, Gary Stanley, and JT Doane presented the possibility of an upgrade to the Veteran's Memorial Parkway to honor Veterans which would include blasting of military branch insignias on the rocks at the site. A visual example was presented to the board and public of what the finished blasting would look like. Mayor Yates questioned the funding and if we would need approval from whomever funded the original site to be sure we are not violating anything. It was confirmed that it would be no cost to the city for the blasting and that it would be funded by the VFW and the Legion. Blasting can begin as soon as all approvals are met and dedication is set for December 7, 2024. Motion to approve the blasting was made by Spencer Kingery contingent upon approval from the original sponsors, second by Breanna Maxwell. Motion carried and passed. (3-0)

JT Doane presented information for rain barrels free to citizens who wish to have one. He stated there were still several available if any citizens would like to have one delivered.

Stuff the bus was presented by JT Doane for school supplies for the upcoming school year. School supplies can be donated and brought to the city building until the fall kick off in late July to "Stuff the bus". The supplies will go towards helping families with school supplies for their students and reducing their cost of purchasing items needed for the year. Laura Stigers will be in charge of the event and the contact for information.




Updates
