

Common Council Meeting– February 3 , 2025
2nd floor City Building 6:00 pm

Council was called to order at 6:00 pm on the second floor of the city building. Live streamed on Youtube and opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call was given by clerk/treasurer-Julie Price. Members present: Kamron Yates, Denny Myers, Doyle Moore, Erin Jubril, and Spencer Kingery. Cody Nelson was late arriving at 6:07pm.

The minutes for January 6, 2025 council meeting was presented for approval. There were no additions or corrections. No discussion for the minutes. Motion to approve the minutes made by Spencer Kingery seconded by Denny Myers. Motion carried and passed. (4-0)

Department Head reports were sent to council prior to the meeting for review. With no objection, the reports were accepted and approved.

Other Business:

Mayor Yates stated that the CCMG 2025-1 was submitted for the City. The project submission was for Market/Adams micro-surfacing and no changes from the last submission.



Public Comments:


Fire Chief Dan Dulin questioned why the firefighters have not been paid for the trial hours worked. Clerk-Treasurer Price commented that it had not been done due to the fact that there is currently not a legal solution to do so. She stated she had spoken with several government agencies, and no one has confirmed that it could be done at the moment. No solution for the issue has been discovered. Dan also mentioned the hydrant contract to which Clerk/treasurer Price stated that there has been no movement because the fire territory lawyer and city lawyer still have not been able to remedy the situation due to contact issues between counsel to discuss. He commented that an invoice had been placed in his mailbox to which Price stated it was for his knowledge/information that hydrant contract payments had gone out, but as she stated in the fire meeting that he was not expected to pay it because of the current questions about the rental. It was simply for his information. He also questioned whether the city attorney had completed the updates to the fire ordinance. Mayor Yate stated that they had not been forgotten and Miriam would be working on the items mentioned.
